

Tee Time Policy

1. Tee time to be utilized on weekends and holidays.
2. Reservations priority to be given to military, retired military, DoD civilians, ID card holders and our annual green fee members.
 - A. Tee time reservations will begin 0800 each Wednesday for the coming weekend, holiday, to include productivity days.
 - B. 0800-1300 is reserved for active duty, retired military, DoD civilians working on Holloman, and annual green fees members of this course.
 - C. 1300 (until times are filled) other eligible patrons.
 - D. Tee times may be made by phone or in person. Should the clubhouse be full of walk-in personnel wishing to reserve tee times, the club house personnel will alternate between one "phone" reservation and one "in-person" reservation.
 - E. Reservations will be given to groups of 3, 4 and 5. Groups must all ride without exceptions.
 - F. Should a group report for their tee time with less than the required number of players, the staff reserves the right to fill the group with standbys or to deny access to the course until a more appropriate time.
 - G. All golfers must report to the golf course at least 15 minutes prior to their tee time on the day of play and register with the Pro Shop. Late arrivals are subject to loss of their tee time.

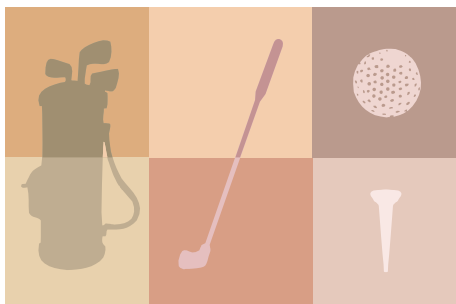


WELCOME

This brochure is provided to acquaint you with the procedures and rules pertinent to play on our course. A great deal of effort has been expended to improve the golfing facilities and the playing conditions. You can assist in this ongoing effort by knowing and applying the rules and etiquette of golf.

We strive to make Apache Mesa Golf Course one of the best golfing facilities in the Air Force; working together we can improve and protect our course and enjoy the recreational pleasure for which this facility was designed. Golf is more than a sport, it is a social event, unique unto itself, in that good manners and good form create an atmosphere of good fun.



GENERAL

The following rules and regulations governing the use of Apache Mesa Golf Course have been established to protect our course and enhance the enjoyment of its patrons. All players should read this brochure and are encouraged to keep a copy with them while using the golf course facilities.

Attire & Conduct

- * Players must be properly attired on the golf course and in the clubhouse.
- * Tank tops, frayed or torn clothing are prohibited.
- * Objectionable conduct including, but not limited to, foul language, club throwing, abuse of course or staff, or any conduct unbecoming of a golfer may warrant expulsion from the golf course.
- * Food or beverages not purchased at the golf course will not be permitted in the clubhouse or on the golf course.
- * You must be 21 years of age to purchase or consume alcoholic beverages in the clubhouse or on the golf course.



Eligibility (AFI 34-262)

1. Active Duty Military and their dependants
2. Retired Military and their dependants
3. Reservist and their dependants
4. Base civilian employees and their spouses
5. All patrons must have a valid ID card in their possession.

Guests

Guests have the same priority as their sponsors. Sponsors must accompany and be responsible for the conduct of their guests. Guest rates are included on the fee chart.

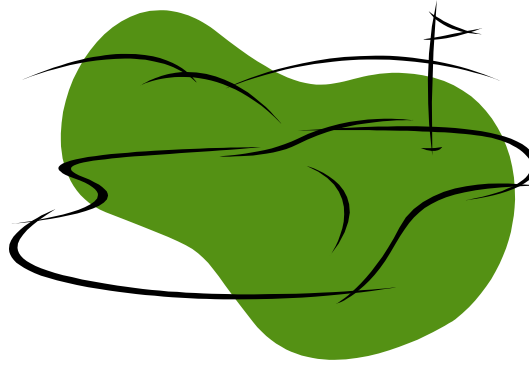
Hours of Operation

- * The hours of operation at the golf course and the Pro Shop are based on seasonal weather changes as well as daylight hours. For more information please call 572-3574.
- * The Snack Bar is open Monday through Friday, from 11 am to 1:30 pm, and closed on all holidays.
- * From time to time it is necessary to temporarily close facilities. When outside facilities, such as the driving range, putting greens or the golf course are closed, that facility then becomes off limits.
- * On Thanksgiving, Christmas Day and New Years Day, the Pro Shop and Snack Bar are closed; however you are more than welcome to use the golf course and practice facilities at your own risk, weather permitting.

Golf Course Etiquette

While it is an old axiom, there is possibly no better advice regarding etiquette than to give your fellow golfer the same consideration you would expect him/her to extend to you.

1. Groups with less than *three* players have no priority and should give way to larger groups.
2. Do not hit until the group ahead is safely out of range.
3. When a hole is completed, move on to the next tee box before marking your scores.
4. Course maintenance personnel have the right of way at all times. For their safety do not hit until they wave you up or readily acknowledge your presence.
5. Golf instruction on the golf course will not be conducted except by personnel authorized by the Golf Facility General Manager. (i.e. Golf Professionals etc.)
6. It is suggested that beginning golfers practice and receive instruction before trying to play a game on the course. Beginners should try to play when the course is not crowded. More enjoyment will result for all golfers,.
7. All golfers and patrons are expected to conduct themselves as ladies and gentlemen at all times.

General Rules

1. USGA rules of golf apply at all times except as amended by the local rules. Local rules are available in the golf shop and/or are printed on the scorecard for your review.
2. Obscene, profane, or abusive language will not be used or tolerated.
3. Players are expected to replace the divots, repair ball marks on the greens, and rake sand smooth in bunkers.
4. Each player must have his/her own set of clubs and a bag. No more than one player may play from one bag.
5. Carts (hand or power) will not be pulled or driven in the areas between the green and surrounding bunkers or across the tee box areas or greens.
6. Throwing clubs, or willful damage to the course (i.e. damaging of the greens or hitting club into the ground and causing damage) will not be tolerated. Disciplinary action may be imposed for any such improper conduct.
7. Extreme care should be taken when removing and replacing the flag stick. The putter head should not be used as a retriever to extract golf balls from the hole.



POWER CARTS

1. A limit of two riders (no matter the age of the occupants) applies to the use of power carts, this is for safety reasons.
2. In order to operate a power cart, a valid drivers license is required to be in the possession of the driver.
3. All carts must remain on approved cart paths or designated areas at all times. Carts may not be allowed on the course if it is extremely soggy and could cause damage to fairways.
4. Players will be required to double up on carts, only two carts per foursome unless otherwise approved by the golf course management.
5. Carts are allowed in the parking area in order to pickup and drop off clubs. After completion of the round, please return carts to the cart staging area.
6. Users will be held responsible for any damage to power carts.
7. Same etiquette applies on the driving range as on the golf course. Players on #1 and #9 have priority, hold up until players are out of the range. Remember safety first.

SPEED OF PLAY GUIDELINES

1. Slower players/groups should always allow faster players/groups to “play through.” Slow play is defined as not keeping pace with the group ahead, or having a complete hole not in use in front of the group when the course is crowded.
2. ***Saving Time!!*** Our goal is to complete all 18 hole rounds in 4 hour or less. Each group should strive to complete each 9 holes in 2 hours or less. Golfers ***PLEASE*** help us accomplish our time goals by playing ***“Ready Golf.”***

For Example:

- A. Be ready to hit when it is your turn. Do not wait for someone to say ***“you’re away.”***
- B. Think about your next shot as you are walking to your ball. Think about club selection before you arrive at your ball.
- C. While someone else is hitting, size up your own shot or putt, have the club you want ready. Take your practice swing and be ready to hit.
- D. If you are far enough away from the player that is hitting and it won’t disturb his/her shot, go ahead and hit.
- E. If the player with the Honor isn’t ready, go ahead and hit. Protocol is nice, but speed of play should take precedence.
- F. Shots don’t go awry! Mark their line with some physical object so you can find it readily. Do not spend more than 5 minutes looking for a lost ball. Play a provisional ball whenever allowed by the Rules of golf.
- G. Slow players/groups may be asked by the Course Host to speed up play. Please comply with their instructions without discussion.
